Village Design Statement Principles

Here is a summary of the Gotherington V.D.S. Principles:-

- Preserve the village as a separate entity distinct from other nearby settlements.
- Protect views from the village to the surrounding hills.
- Sizeable development shall include landscaping and green areas in keeping with a village setting.
- Fences, walls and outbuildings bordering the open countryside should not create visual barriers.
- Development shall include new footpaths where appropriate.
- Development shall be consistent with best design practice appropriate to a rural setting.
- Development shall be compatible with the existing character, scale and form of the village.
- Developments should not unduly diminish the existing ratio between buildings and gardens.
- All new properties shall have ample and unobtrusive parking.
- Infill development should be consistent with the scale of existing houses and gardens.
- Infill development and extensions to buildings should be compatible with the existing character, setting and rural nature of the village.
- Extensions to existing properties shall be designed to be an integral part of the property and shall be harmonious with the character, scale and form of the existing building.
- Development shall preserve the rural character of the village by maintaining the existing playing fields and public green spaces.
- The footprint and height of any new housing shall be consistent with the existing character, scale and rural nature of the village.
- Development shall include evidence that a survey of the impact of the new build upon the village's traffic and services has been undertaken.
- Any development should take into account the possible effects on local services.
